Information is gathered, synthesized and analyzed to assist agency personnel in the most effective ways possible. In addition to identifying trends and patterns, crime analysts research and analyze long-term problems and can apply criminal intelligence analysis tactics for local agencies.

Offered in collaboration with the California Department of Justice, this program features courses in research methods and crime analysis, to prepare you with the tools needed to make informed decisions on a case. ADMISSION

HOW TO EARN THIS CERTIFICATE
